2015 TOUR GARDENS

- Evelyn Davenport Navarre Teaching and Enabling Garden
2009 Curtain Pole Road, Chattanooga, TN 37406
 - We encourage you to make the Chattanooga Area Food Bank's Teaching Garden your first stop on the tour! The CAFB's produce beds are highly functional, providing over 2000 pounds of produce to the Emergency Food Box Program each year. Our demonstration garden was designed to show how to make the most of growing in urban spaces, as well as small, difficult, or challenging places.
- Scott and Olga Drucker
4403 Tennessee Avenue, Chattanooga, TN 37409
 - This "English-Style" Cottage Garden was started almost ten years ago by local landscape designer Scott Drucker and his wife Olga of Dream Gardens Landscape Design & Installation as a personal oasis in the heart of historic St. Elmo. It is a grassless garden with full sun and shaded areas that allow for plant diversity. The garden is divided into three distinct "Garden Rooms" and is filled to the brim with heirloom roses, camellias, hydrangeas, perennials, and many other interesting plant collections which complement the Druckers' 100+ year old home. This is their first time on the Food Bank Garden Tour.

8900 Winding Bluff Lane, Soddy Daisy, TN 37379
 - The Spanish home sits on a bluff so you can expect a marvelous atmosphere with spectacular views. The garden features many natural rock formations as well as several beautiful stone additions from DeWitt and MacDonald. You won't want to miss their unusual variety of evergreens – what a treat!

1103 Bunker Ridge Trail, Soddy Daisy, TN 37379
 - This relaxed cottage garden is in its seventh season. Prepare yourself for more of nature's beauty as this garden overlooks a 5 acre pond. A neighboring wooded area lends itself well to shaded gardens, but the Nelson garden also features a vegetable garden and sunny beds for a lovely garden mix.

 - Rounding out our tour is the Przybylinski garden in Ferger Place. The Przybylinski's enjoy planting a delightful range of plants. We think you'll enjoy their presentation as you'll find much of their garden displayed in interesting and antique planters. It may inspire you to try your hand at container gardening!

2009 Curtain Pole Road, Chattanooga, TN 37406
- Scott and Olga Drucker
4403 Tennessee Avenue, Chattanooga, TN 37409
 - VIA TN-58S
 - Head NE on Curtain Pole Rd.
 - Turn R onto TN-58S (for 4.9 mi)
 - Turn R onto Broad St (for 1.5 mi)
 - Take slight L on Tennessee Avenue (for 0.4 mi)
 - Turn L to stay on Tennessee Ave – destination will be on the right
- Mark DeWitt and Cathleen MacDonald
8900 Winding Bluff Lane, Soddy Daisy, TN 37379
 - VIA TN-153N
 - Head NE on Curtain Pole Rd.
 - Turn L onto TN-58N (for 2.8 mi)
 - Take the TN-319N ramp to DuPont Pkwy (for 2.8 mi)
 - Turn L onto TN-153N/TN-319N (signs for TN -153N) and follow TN-153N (for 5 mi)
 - Continue onto Dayton Blvd (1.7 mi) and Continue onto Dayton Pike (1.1 mi)
 - Turn L onto Montlake Rd (3.2 mi)
 - Turn R onto Brow Lake Rd (.7 mi) then take slight R onto Winding Bluff Ln- destination will be on the right
- Don and Leslie Nelson
1103 Bunker Ridge Trail, Soddy Daisy, TN 37379
 - VIA TN-153N
 - Turn L onto Amnicola Hwy and merge onto TN-319 N/Dupont Pkway N (2.8 mi)
 - Take L onto Hwy 153/TN-153 (4.8 mi)
 - Stay straight onto Dayton Blvd (1.7 mi) which becomes Dayton Pike (1.1 mi)
 - Turn L onto Montlake Rd (4.0 mi)
 - Turn R onto Brow Lade Rd (.2 mi) and turn R onto Bunker Ridge Trl (.1 mi)- destination will be on the left
- Fred and Bev Przybylinski
100 Eveningside Drive, Chattanooga, TN 37404
 - VIA TN-153N
 - Turn R onto Amnicola Hwy which becomes Riverside Dr (.4 mi)
 - Turn L onto Wilcox Blvd (.4 mi)

- Turn L onto N Holtzclaw Ave (2.2 mi)
- Turn L on E Main St/ US-41 (.3 mi)- if you reach E 16h St, you've gone too far
- Turn R onto Eveningside Dr (.1 mi)- destination is on the left.
